





The historical and cultural richness of Palestine is reflected visually in its costume and embroidery. Distinguished by boldness of color, richness of pattern, and diversity of style, and combined with great needlework skill, these textiles have long played an important role in Palestinian culture and identity.

Based on over twenty-five years of extensive field research and the culling of museum resources and publications from around the world, this book presents the most exhaustive and up-to-date study of the origins of Palestinian embroidery and costume—from antiquity through medieval Arab textile arts to the present. It documents region by region the evolution of costume and the textile arts in Palestine in the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. It is lavishly illustrated with over 500 full-color photographs from the highly praised Munayyer Collection, which includes a whole range of embroidered textiles from traditional costumes and coin headdresses of Palestinian village women to cloaks and jackets worn by village men to belts, sashes, and footwear. The exquisite colors of the silk stitching on natural linens are a feast for the eye.





As "elders" in the Tibetan community, they have collaborated with photo archivist Jane Moore and a creative team to produce a memorable, comprehensive, and close-up portrait. It offers, in these uncertain times, an uplifting retrospective of an iconic leader, a heritage, a cause, and a creative vision that have won the attention and hearts of people around the world.

In a tent at the foot of a mountain in Palestine, hundreds of years ago, our storyteller and her twin sister are born. Her newlywed parents name her *Qamr* (Moon), and her sister *Shams* (Sun). Their small caravan is journeying from the mother's city back to the father's remote ancestral village atop the mountain.

This village suffers from isolation—and a curse, which her young family tries to undo. But when both parents' lives are cut short, Qamr and her sister are left orphans. And so, Qamr decides to pursue her mother's and father's dreams of discovering the world—its people, places and stories. With the red book in hand that brought her parents together, she sets out on a daring journey, on caravans and ships, across empires

Telling tales to survive, Qamr crosses deserts and seas: to Jerusalem and Gaza; Egypt, Tangier, Andalusia and Genoa; Abyssinia, India, the Maldives and Yemen. Kidnapped by bandits, sold as a slave to the House of a mad King, studying with a polymath, disguising as a man and falling in love for the first time—with a pirate: Qamr searches irrepressibly for life, in endless stories within stories.

SONIA NIMR is a leading Palestinian author and storyteller who weaves together contemporary stories with folklore for readers of all ages. She is also the author of two books in English: *Ghaddar the Ghoul and Other Palestinian Stories* and *A Little Piece of Ground* (co-written with Elizabeth Laird).

MARCIA LYNX QUALEY is a writer and editor who founded *ArabLit* and *ArabLit* Quarterly. She cohosts the BULAQ podcast and has co-translated the co-written *Ghady & Rawan* (2019).


The American Granddaughter depicts the American occupation of Iraq through the eyes of a young Iraqi-American woman, who returns to her country as an interpreter for the US Army. Through the narrator's conflicting emotions, we see the tragedy of a country which, having battled to emerge from dictatorship, then finds itself under foreign occupation.

At the beginning of America's occupation of Iraq, Zeina returns to her war-torn homeland as an interpreter for the US Army. Her formidable grandmother—the only family member that Zeina believes she has in Iraq—gravely disapproves of her granddaughter's actions. Then Zeina meets Haider and Muhaymin, two "brothers" she knows nothing of, and falls deeply in love with Muhaymin, a militant in the Al Mehdi Army. These experiences force her to question all her values.

Born in Baghdad, INAAM KACHACHI currently lives in Paris. Her novel *The Outcast* was shortlisted for the 2019 International Prize for Arabic Fiction.

NARIMAN YOUSSEF is an Egyptian writer and translator. She is the author of *Summer of Unrest: Tahrir—18 Days of Grace.*

SUMMER WITH THE ENEMY

Set in Raqqa, this novel follows the charming, if at times difficult, everyday life of three women— Lamis, who is in her thirties, her mother Najwa, and her grandmother Karma—and all of the complexities of their relationships with each other, their extended family, and their wider social worlds.

Lamis, having fled the war in her home country, arrives in the German city of Cologne to meet Nicholas, a lecturer at the University of Munich, who welcomes her and enables her to pursue her studies in Germany. In the 1980s, Nicholas followed in the footsteps of the Arab astronomer Al-Battani and spent a summer in Raqqa. While doing research and surveying the sky, he met and fell in love with her mother Najwa. The courtship tortures Lamees and Nicholas became her sworn enemy. Through Lamis's voice, we hear the story of three generations of women, and learn about the history of the Arab region and surrounding areas over the course of a century.

Summer with the Enemy is a compelling intergenerational novel that also reminds us that Syria and Syrians have never been isolated from the world.

SHAHLA UJAYLI is an award-winning Syrian writer, born in 1976. Her novel A Sky So Close to Us was shortlisted for the 2016 International Prize for Arabic Fiction.

MICHELLE HARTMAN is a professor of Arabic and francophone literature at McGill University in Montreal and the translator of several works from Arabic.

"Drought. Drought again! When drought seasons come, things begin to change. Life and objects change. Humans change too, and no more so than in their moods!"

It is not long before the reader of *Endings* discovers that this drought is not just occasional but an enduring condition faced by a community on the edge of the desert, the village of al-Tiba. Never do we discover exactly where this village is in the Arab world, and al-Tiba thus becomes a symbol for all villages facing nature unaided by modern technology. We hear of Abu Zaku, the village carpenter; of the Mukhtar; and above all of 'Assaf and his dog. But it is the people of al-Tiba as a group who discuss and argue about their past, present, and future, and the forces of change.

Endings is striking not only for its setting and style of narrative, but for being a vivid commentary on the emergence of the modern city and its urban middle class.

'ABD AL-RAHMAN MUNIF wrote fifteen novels, including the monumental quintet *Cities of Salt*, and won numerous distinguished Arab awards. He died in 2004.

ROGER ALLEN is the author and editor of numerous books relating to Arabic literature and translator of Nobel Prize-winning author Naguib Mahfouz's *God's World*, *Al-Summan Wa-Al-Kharif* and *Al-Maraya*, among other works.

In 2014, a coup d'état in Sanaa paved the way for a devastating conflict in Yemen. Andrew Moscrop, a physician, cancelled plans to return to the country that he had once called home. Instead, he returned to his diaries and delved into memories of a time when he lived in a rambling old tower house in Sanaa. As the war unfolded, he re-read the accounts of past travelers to the country. And while working in Greece, treating refugees from other Middle Eastern war zones, he began writing a book set in Yemen.

These visitors include blundering missionaries, aristocratic Englishmen, and unlikely spies. Moscrop delivers an intriguing perspective on Western encounters with the Islamic world, examining the imagery and clichés by which Yemen has been represented from the sixteenth century to the present.

Evocative descriptions of Sanaa and its unique cityscape, as well as empathetic portrayals of people encountered and events experienced, all create a narrative by turns thoughtful and unexpected.

ANDREW MOSCROP received his degree in public health from Harvard University, was trained as a doctor in Edinburgh, and studied history in London.


